TOPIC FOR THE SESSION – BRIDGING THE GAP: TOOLS FOR CONSTRUCTIVE CONFLICT MANAGEMENT

The session commenced with a warm welcome speech delivered by the Head of the Department of Information Technology, **Dr. Neeraj Gupta**. Addressing the students, Dr. Neeraj Gupta expressed delight at the enthusiastic turnout and emphasized the importance of developing conflict management skills, especially for future engineers who will play key roles in various team-based projects and leadership positions. He highlighted those conflicts, while often seen as negative, can be opportunities for growth and innovation when approached constructively. The speech set the tone for the day, encouraging students to actively engage with the content and make the most of the learning opportunities provided.

The session aimed to equip students with practical tools and techniques to manage and resolve conflicts constructively, ultimately fostering a collaborative environment in their future workplaces. The session's objectives were to help students understand the nature and dynamics of conflict, explore various conflict management styles, introduce practical tools for constructive resolution, encourage self-awareness and emotional intelligence, and develop communication skills that facilitate positive outcomes in conflict situations. The session was divided into four parts, designed to build on the previous one, ensuring a comprehensive understanding of conflict management.

In the session, students explored the nature of conflict, learning to see it as a natural and inevitable part of human interaction that can lead to positive outcomes if managed effectively. Ms. Preeti introduced different conflict management styles, including competing, accommodating, avoiding, collaborating, and compromising. Through interactive activities, students identified their default conflict management style and understood its impact on relationships and outcomes. The core of the session was where students were introduced to practical tools and techniques for resolving conflicts constructively. These included active listening, assertive communication, negotiation strategies, and the use of "I" statements to express feelings and needs without blaming others. Role-playing exercises allowed students to practice these techniques in simulated conflict situations, enhancing their ability to apply them in real-life scenarios. The session focused on developing emotional intelligence and self-awareness, crucial components of effective conflict

management. Students learned to recognize and manage their emotions, as well as those of others, to prevent escalation and facilitate resolution.

The session concluded with a thoughtful thank you speech delivered by the Head of the Department, Dr. Neeraj Gupta. The HOD expressed heartfelt appreciation to the students for their active participation and engagement throughout the day. Emphasizing the importance of applying the skills learned, the HOD encouraged students to use the tools and techniques discussed to manage conflicts effectively in both their professional and personal lives.
